<p><u>Consultation:</u></p> <p>1. Health IM Project</p> <p>i. Ottawa Police Services</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Overview of IM with OPS. Section 17 Mental Health Act. • Produces 3 scores 1-10 that leads to an outcome low score is left with follow up high score results in client taken to hospital • The form allows for an easier triage process once they arrive at the hospital • Pre-existing template was 4 pages long and was very thorough with very useful information but had no way of send this to the hospital. Had no wait times for ER • Merged the Health IM & old template • Capture children involvement, CAS notification • Does not accumulate historical data • CMHA has funding for an outreach worker to work with OPS • Officers are reacting to the statistics on wait times • 40% section 17 admissions • Working with Hospitals & front line for better uptake & implementation • Average follow up time is 24hours • Advantages for the community • When someone is brought in by police in the past by the time they were seen there might be notes brought in by police. This program allows for immediate feedback that someone has been brought in on section 17 • Important to review after the first year to identify opportunities <p><u>Comments:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <i>Persons are apprehended not arrested</i> ▪ <i>Software is on all MDT's and desktop available to front line patrol officers, schools,</i> ▪ <i>Training was delivered as train the trainer model</i> ▪ <i>Does this system apply to Alzheimer's/Dementia? It is on a case by case basis and depends on dual diagnosis. No current breakdown by age</i> ▪ <i>Currently the IM is being complete in the police car looking at an app-based model in 2019 so it can be complete in person</i> ▪ <i>Can parents/caregivers ask to see the IM? Not currently being asked. There is a question about concerned family members</i> ▪ <i>Officers are determining risks</i> ▪ <i>IM is based on information gathered</i> ▪ <i>F/U calls made if there are no apprehension. Calls can be made to caregivers. It would depend on age & form 1 & 2.</i> 	<p>Holly Watson</p>

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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <i>Do not always complete a mental health template on every call</i> ▪ <i>Scores could follow someone around worry about the scores labelling them instead of assisting them.</i> ▪ <i>Main goals for the system are to keep people out of institutions and in their homes</i> ▪ <i>System is not punitive</i> ▪ <i>Tools allows police officers a pathway for observations of Mental Health issues making things more objective</i> ▪ <i>Pilot project for OPS. There will be a 1-year evaluation based on the data completed by a University.</i> ▪ <i>Waiting for 100% compliance then will send a survey to officers</i> ▪ <i>Officers are not always aware that they are</i> ▪ <i>Align some of the stats with people being diverted to mental health court.</i> ▪ <i>Cornwall is having great outcomes with VSMART & IM with reductions in wait times</i> ▪ <i>Pilot will be reviewed June 2019</i>
